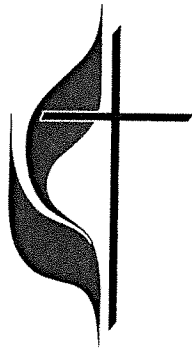

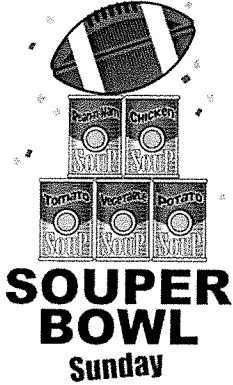

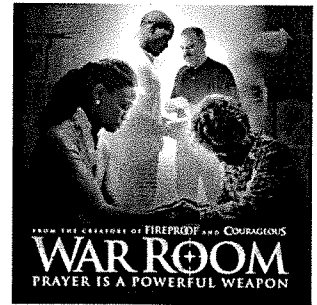


STRAWBERRY

There are a few spaces available to join Christ by the Sea UM Church on a mission trip to the Bahamas May 26-June 1. The church group will be joining the Vero Kiwanis Youth Service Team to do work at "Every Child Counts" which is a school for special needs individuals. The cost at this time is \$600. War Room is a compelling faith drama willed with humor and heart that became the #1 movie in US theaters and received raving reviews from audiences of all ages. Tony and Elizabeth Jordan have it all - great jobs, a beautiful daughter, and their dream house. But appearances can be deceiving. Their world is actually crumbling under the strain of a failing marriage. But their lives take an unexpected turn when they meet Miss Clara.



As many of you are aware, the United Methodist church has been wrestling with the issue of homosexuality since the 1970's. At the 2016 General Conference (which meets every 4 years and decides policy for the UM church worldwide) to avoid a split over this issue designated a special general conference February 23-26, 2019, to address this issue solely. The Bishops designated a representative group of people from around the world to meet over a 2 year period to pray, study and discuss options and then make a recommendation to the Council of Bishops regarding the direction the UM church should go. The Way Forward Commission made their recommendation of the One Church Plan to the Council of Bishops

After much prayer and discussion the Council of Bishops made the following recommendations to the special session of General Conference in 2019.

- The primary plan recommended is called The One Church Plan which would allow more freedom at the conference and local church levels to ordain LGBTQ clergy or to officiate at same gender unions. The plan would remove the restrictive language against the practice of homosexuality in the Book Discipline, the denomination's policy book. The plan also recognizes that every church or clergy are not of the same mind and gives value to that. The plan adds assurances to pastors and conferences who in good conscience cannot perform same-sex weddings or ordain "self-avowed practicing" gay clergy that they don't have to do so. Central conferences — church regions in Africa, Asia and Europe — could maintain current restrictions. The structure of the UM church would remain the same. The plan "encourages a generous unity by giving United Methodists the ability to address different missional contexts in ways that reflect their theological convictions."

The Bishops decided to add two others plans that will also be presented to make sure all voices are heard:

- The Traditionalist Plan, which would affirm the current language in the denomination's Book of Discipline, the denomination's governing document, and seek to strengthen enforcement.
- The Connectional-Conference plan, which would allow conferences to choose among three connectional conferences for affiliation. The connectional conferences would align based on theology or perspective on LGBTQ ministry — be it traditionalist, progressive or allowing for a variety of approaches. This plan would require multiple amendments to the denomination's constitution.

It should be noted that even though the One Church Plan is the one recommended by the Council of Bishops and the other two plans will also be considered, any of these plans can be amended during General Conference. At this point no one knows what will be decided.

This is a difficult decision that will affect many aspects of the UM church including worldwide agencies such as our relief agencies (UMCOR), children's homes, Wesley centers (UM college groups) to name a few. Clergy pensions for current and retired clergy may be affected. It should be noted that no matter what decision is made in February, it will take a period of transition time before any decision made can be put into effect.

What can we do now? I invite each one of you to pray for the delegates to General Conference, pray for the process and our United Methodist church on February 23-26. It is my prayer that the Holy Spirit will be at work in an amazing way to fulfill the ministry of Jesus to the world at this conference in an unexpected way. I also ask that you be sensitive to the fact that everybody has different opinions on this issue for various reasons, many which are personal. Talking in a derogatory manner about one position or another can be hurtful to someone around you. Throughout this debate we must still remember our call of kindness and grace to all people through Jesus Christ.

I feel my role as your pastor is to be as neutral as I can in these days leading up to a decision to encourage conversation between all people. I am available and welcome anyone who has questions and would like to discuss this issue further to contact me. Blessings, Linda

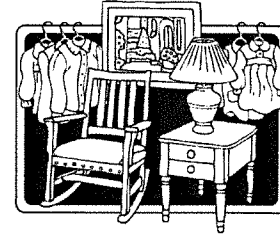

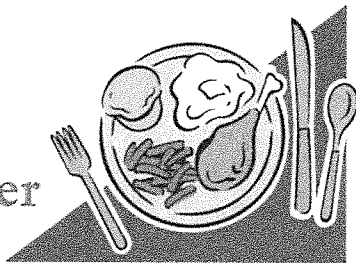

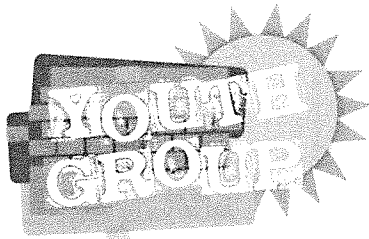
much needed time to come together for the residents to socialize and build community spirit. Building relationships and sharing common interests help each of us feel valuable and needed.

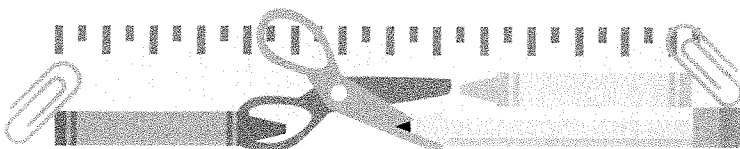

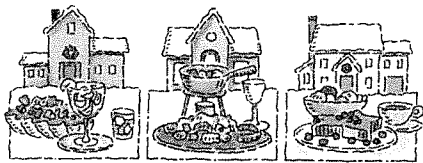


Lent is Coming! Lent is the 40 days of preparation before Easter which is April 21st this year. Mark your calendar now for these Lent events:

Childcare will be available at the church for the appetizer course of the meal. When we gather for dinner, your children will join you and go with you for dessert. Please ask about carpooling!

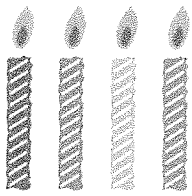

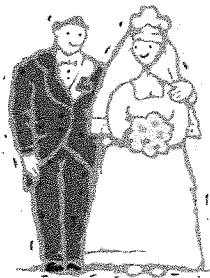
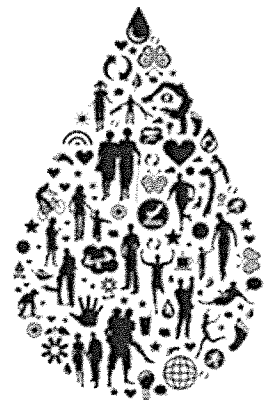
