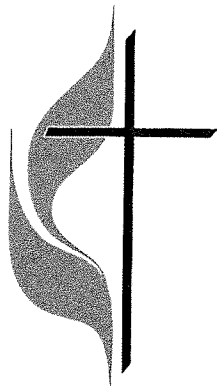

Hello Friends,

Summer has begun! Congratulations to all teachers, students and their families for another year completed. Now it is time to have some fun and renewal time!

June may be the start of summer for most, but in Florida annual conference it is conference time when clergy and lay delegates from around the state get together to do the business of the church. It is like the board meeting of the Florida conference. As conference prepares to gather soon (June 6-9) I wanted to update you on what is happening regarding the issues relating to homosexuality.

This is not a voting issue of Annual Conference in June, but will create conversation and press so wanted you informed.

At the 2016 General Conference (which meets every 4 years and decides policy for the UM church worldwide) a special general conference was designated in February, 2019, to address the issue of homosexuality. The Bishops designated a representative group of people from around the world to meet over a 2 year period to make a recommendation to the Council of Bishops regarding the way the UM church should go. In May, The Way Forward Commission made their recommendation to the Council of Bishops. The Discipline currently states that we hold all people as people of worth and extend grace to all, but that homosexuality is incompatible to Christian teaching and professing homosexuals are not allowed to be ordained in UM church and clergy who perform same sex marriages will face judicial charges and can lose their ordination. As a worldwide church there are many different contexts in which clergy find themselves trying to minister to all people which creates the current situation. It is a very complicated issue. For instance in Africa, it is illegal to state you are homosexual and you can be legally killed for it by the government. In other places where same sex marriages are accepted, clergy can't minister to the people of their church who are gay to marry them and share acceptance.

The following is the recommendations made to the Council of Bishops and the recommendation that will be made to the special session of General Conference in 2019.

- The primary plan recommended is called The One Church Plan which would allow more freedom at the conference and local church levels to ordain LGBTQ clergy or to officiate at same gender unions. The plan would remove the restrictive language against the practice of homosexuality in the Book Discipline, the denomination's policy book. The plan also adds assurances to pastors and conferences who in good conscience cannot perform same-sex weddings or ordain "self-avowed practicing" gay clergy that they don't have to do so. Central conferences — church regions in Africa, Asia and Europe — could maintain current restrictions.

The plan "encourages a generous unity by giving United Methodists the ability to address different missional contexts in ways that reflect their theological convictions."

The other two plans that will also be presented are:

- The Traditionalist Plan, which would affirm the current language in the denomination's Book of Discipline, the denomination's governing document, and seek to strengthen enforcement.
- The Connectional-Conference plan, which would allow conferences to choose among three connectional conferences for affiliation. The connectional conferences would align based on theology or perspective on LGBTQ ministry — be it traditionalist, progressive or allowing for a variety of approaches. This plan would require multiple amendments to the denomination's constitution.

At this point no one knows what will be decided at General Conference in February as other resolutions may be presented so I urge you to pray as we wait. In our own church there are a variety of personal positions on this issue that we need to be sensitive and respectful of. In the fall we will have opportunities for small group discussions, times of listening and sharing in Christian love. We remember that as followers of Christ we are taught the true meaning of grace and acceptance even in times of disagreement we are to give worth to each person that is a son or daughter of God. As a family we share respect even in disagreement.

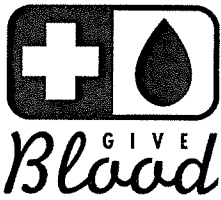


Calling all musicians! Throughout the months of June, July, and August anyone wanting to share a musical talent at the 11:10 service please contact me, Carlene Howle.

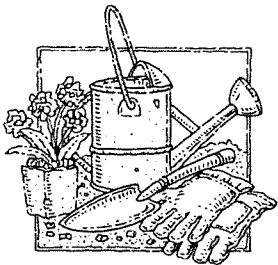

Prayer Garden

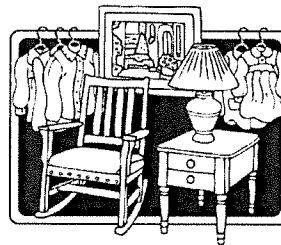

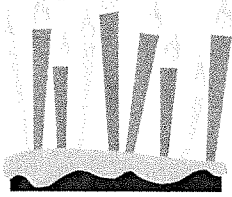
