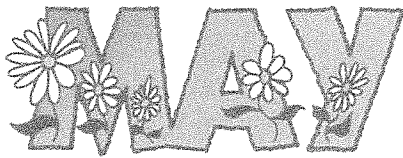

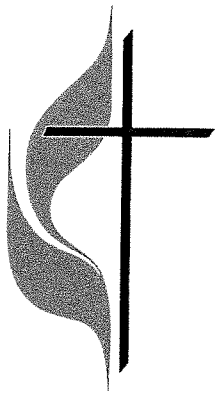

Hello Friends,

April 15th was announcement Sunday in all Florida United Methodist Churches. I am happy about this decision by the Staff Parish Committee to ask me to return and the confirmation by the Cabinet. July 1st is my official start to our second year together.

I recognize it is difficult for a congregation to have a new pastor come to the church. No minister is like the other and it can be difficult to get used to a new person and different ways that they may do things. I want to thank all of you for your warm welcome right from the beginning and your patience as I learned about this church and community. I'm still working on names, but I will get there! Your heart for Christ and serving others is just amazing and I am blessed to minister with you in this caring congregation.

As we start our second year together I am excited about possibilities that are in front of us. We do have some challenges ahead, but as we stay focused on Jesus I have no doubt we will see the Holy Spirit at work in amazing ways! As I think about ministry that has happened just in this month of April God's presence is certainly at work. Last week we had a meeting to begin to take our ministry to the homeless and economically disadvantaged in the community forward. It was exciting that 25 people from our church and the community showed up to make plans! We also had a calendar planning time in which it was fun to see ideas for activities and ministries for the church take shape for the next six months. Ten people came to pray for the church and each other in this month's prayer time. Six youth were confirmed which was great to celebrate with them! Four people have made the decision to make this church their church home this month. Twenty people had fun at April's Dine Out. UMW had a successful Bingo Time. There are so many other blessings to celebrate this month! And next month...and the next month...and the next! God is good!

CHURCH PICNIC

Everyone is invited to a church family picnic from 1-4pm on **Sunday, May 6th** at **Micco Park** (9655 Riverview Drive in Little Hollywood). We have reserved the large covered pavilion that has picnic tables and the United Methodist Men will serve hot dogs and hamburgers hot off the grill. The church will provide the hamburgers, hotdogs, buns, condiments, plates, napkins and eating utensils.

The youth group will be hosting games such as a water balloon toss, tug of war and a three legged race. All children, youth and adults can participate! There is a basketball court and a softball field so any sports or game equipment like Frisbees, footballs or outdoor lawn games would also be great to bring!

We ask that you bring a picnic side dish to share, your own drinks, and lawn chairs if you have them. This is a great opportunity to invite someone outside of the church to the fun.



PRAYER SERVICE

In May our prayer time will be a week earlier on **May 7th** at 6:30 p.m. in the sanctuary. This is a wonderful time of quiet in the sanctuary to listen to God, pray for others and the church. Everyone is invited.

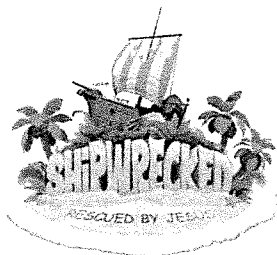

If you want to see what kind of priority God has in your life, check out your checkbook. As you look at the past few months, did you make decisions as if things belonged to you or to God? We continue to see a repeat in our financial picture. Our income is not covering all of our expenses. Yes, we went into this year with a budget that had expenses higher than projected income, so this is not a surprise. 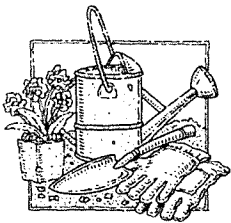
Blessings to all from the UMM. We are excited about our activities and we are looking forward to May:

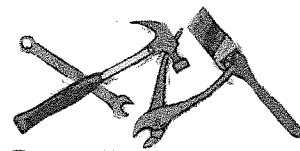

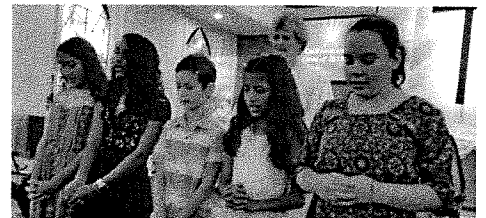
